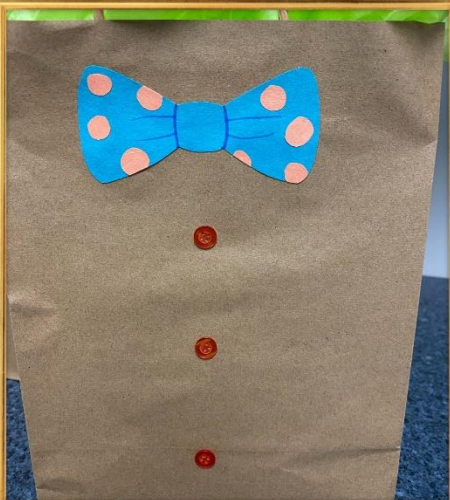
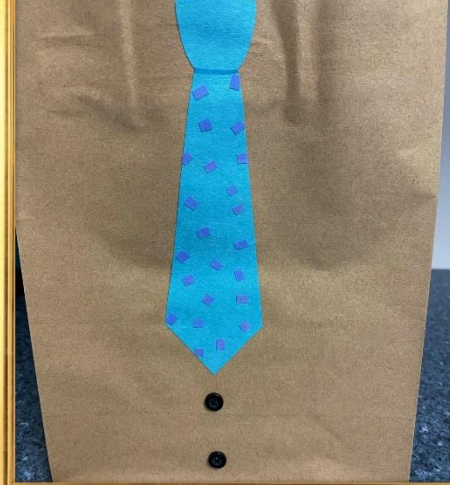
About Dinsdale Personal Care
